The Kidney Buddy Program (Kidney Buddies) is a peer support program which aims to connect people living with kidney disease, donors and recipients, their carers, supporters, parents and family members with a Kidney Buddy who has lived experience.

Kidney Buddies can provide social and emotional support through unfamiliar situations. and share information, learning and practical experiences.

The Buddy relationship can be a great way to connect socially to other members of the community. Contact can be via phone, online or in person.

What is the Kidney Buddy Program?



How can Kidney Buddies help?

- Helping people diagnosed with kidney disease, new to dialysis or those preparing for a kidney transplant as either a patient or living donor to find information and resources
- Sharing lived experiences and stories to help people living with kidney disease better understand treatment, lifestyle factors or changes they may face whilst living with kidney disease.
- Supporting a partner, carer, family or friend of a person living with kidney disease to manage their role, connect to support groups, and access information.
- Providing social and emotional support to carers or family who may be isolated or finding it difficult to adjust to supporting someone close living with kidney disease.

Please note – Kidney Buddies are not medical experts and are not able to provide mental health counselling or medical advice regarding treatments, medication, blood and medical test interpretation, or specific hospital or specialist referral information.

Who can request a Kidney Buddy?

Anyone living with or caring for someone with chronic kidney disease

- Newly diagnosed with early or late-stage chronic kidney disease
- Considering dialysis options
- Preparing for a transplant
- Considering becoming a kidney donor
- Parents and carers of children living with kidney disease
- Young people living with kidney disease
- Partners, carers or supporters of someone living with kidney disease

How will I be paired with a Kidney Buddy?

Once we receive a Kidney Buddy request, we will consult our registry of trained Kidney Buddies to identify a suitable match. The Kidney Buddy will make contact to set up the first meeting. We'll provide guidelines covering how to get the most out of a Buddy pairing including frequency of meetings and what might be discussed. Most pairings speak once or twice, whilst some have become regular catch ups.
